



Militarism

- Militarism Rapid building of military
 - Armies in Europe doubled in size
- Conscription- forced military service

Militarism

- The largest army was Russia
- Germany builds up navy to compete with Britain



Bigger armies and navies = increased tension

Alliances

- Alliance Mutual support of one another in event of an attack
- Triple Alliance: Austria-Hungary, Germany, and Italy
- Triple Entente: France, Great Britain, and Russia
 - Entente An Agreement

Triple Entente

 Triple Entente - Served as a counterweight to Triple Alliance



 France wanted revenge against Germany for taking Alsace Lorraine

Russia was protector of the Slavic world






Imperialism

- Imperialism The domination of one country by a stronger nation
- Most notably seen in Africa, China and India








Nationalism

- Nationalism Belief that one's loyalty should be to a nation sharing a common culture
- Countries were looking to extend their borders

 France was upset over loss of Alsace-Lorraine






MAIN Causes of WWI



Balkan Crisis

- Ottoman Empire Once powerful, now a failing empire
 - Known as the "Sickman of Europe"
- Austria-Hungary seeks to control this area








Bosnia Issue

□ Serbia wanted to include Bosnia in the Serbian Kingdom – Similar nationality

□ Instead, Austria-Hungary annexes Bosnia


□Annex – Taking land under control of a different

- Franz Ferdinand is heir to the Austrian throne.
 - Nephew of Emperor Franz Josef ~
- Serbia does not like him.





Sarajevo, 1914

 Franz Ferdinand was assassinated by Gavrilo Princip, a Serbian nationalist.

 Princip was the member of a terrorist organization called the Black Hand.




The Ultimatum
